Vermont on track to expand statewide CLEAN Program

In Vermont, the Clean Energy Bill (H. 468) has passed the House and is on its way to the Senate. As written, H. 468 would significantly expand the state's Standard Offer program for renewable energy from 50 megawatts (MW) to 150 MW by adding 10 MW annually to the program, beginning April 2013. The Standard Offer program, which guarantees long-term, fixed-price contracts to renewable energy generators, has proven to be one of Vermont's best tools to promote the rapid development of cost-effective renewable energy projects.
