The FIT Coalition has officially changed its name to the Clean Coalition. This new name better reflects our broad policy work in clean energy and our long-term goals.

The Clean Coalition is a non-profit organization whose mission is to make clean local energy accessible now. In 2011, our top goals are to work at the local, state, and federal levels to implement Clean Local Energy Accessible Now (CLEAN) programs in order to remove barriers that currently impede renewable energy project development. Most importantly, the Clean Coalition will work to create level playing fields that address the three biggest hurdles to renewable energy project development: securing contracts with utilities, gaining transparent information about connecting to the grid, and providing pricing certainty that facilitates project financing. The fastest way for the United States to regain leadership in the New Energy Economy is to assure that risks and costs associated with deploying clean local energy are minimized, and the Clean Coalition is working harder than ever to accelerate winning outcomes.
